Issue: Transportation and Engineering is requesting approval of a contract with HD Quincy, LLC, a developer, in which the developer agrees to pay one-half of the intersection improvements at Quincy Avenue and Tufts Avenue to construct a single lane roundabout. Transportation & Engineering previously briefed the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) regarding this contract on December 17, 2024. Since that briefing, the parties continued negotiations and the total cost of the improvements increased from a not-to-exceed amount of \$3,327,037 to \$3,748,184. These costs will be shared equally by the developer and the County. The County will be responsible for a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,874,092. Upon satisfactory completion of the construction, the County will pay its share of the costs from the South Impact Fee Fund as identified in the Traffic Impact Fee Program. This agreement will provide the means and guidelines to accomplish the reimbursement to the developer.

Background: The developer's planned improvements include a traffic report and analysis that showed that the intersection of Quincy Ave and Tufts Ave would be failing during peak hour traffic. The remedy for this failure would be either a traffic signal or a roundabout. Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) will not allow a traffic signal because of the proximity to their newly constructed C470 ramp roundabout. The Traffic Impact Fee program had included this segment of Quincy to provide and fund the improvements. Staff would like to pay the developer for the County's share of these improvements after the acceptance of the roadway in one lump sum. If improvements are completed in 2025, a budget supplemental will need to be submitted, or if completion is not until 2026, the funds will be budgeted in 2026.

Discussion:

The agreement addresses the following major terms:

- The County's improvement costs and definition of costs by each party.
- The construction and oversight of the roundabout improvements.
- Standards for design and construction.
- Change orders and reimbursements.
- Guarantee period.
